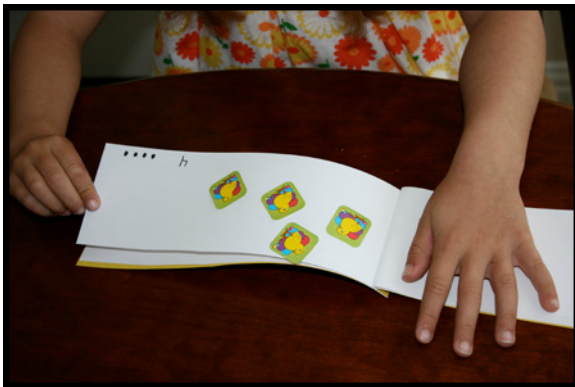




MAKING A NUMBER BOOK



Rote memorization of numbers is meaningless until the child understands what two or three actually mean. Parent/teacher will write one to five or one to ten with dots beside each individual number on separate pages in the Number Book. By matching stamps or stickers to the dots, using one-to-one correspondence, the meaning of numbers will be understood.



Instructions:

Using a key word card or sentence strip as a template, trace a front and back cover for your number book out of construction paper. Cut 5 or 10 pages (depending upon the age of the child) out of white paper and staple the white pages between the covers to make a book. Write a title on the cover, such as "My Number Book" or use the child's name instead of the word "My". Child places correct quantity of stickers or ink stamps on each page.
